

The story began at fourteen seventeen minutes after midnight, while the world was in its relatively warm rooms. We will not say in the warm room, because all people in northern Syria are below the extreme poverty line. Who would have thought that the tents are the .safest place? It was a difficult day

The catastrophe began, the body shook and the eyes bulged from the force of the violent vibration that struck the outskirts of Turkey's border with northern Syria

Buildings began to collapse, and houses made of mud began to collapse in northern Syria, in the Idlib border area with Turkey, leaving thousands of dead, thousands injured, and hundreds missing. Until the date of the hour, rescue teams deployed with simple material capabilities with scissors of stone, with buildings that have several floors. The Syrian rescue teams were unable to pursue the destruction. In each region I started with one after the other

As for the one who died, he went to his grave, not needing food or drink

Suffering with others who lost their homes, stones, money, and identification papers. Today they are out in the open, with no food or drink for them, and other children who have lost the passion of this world

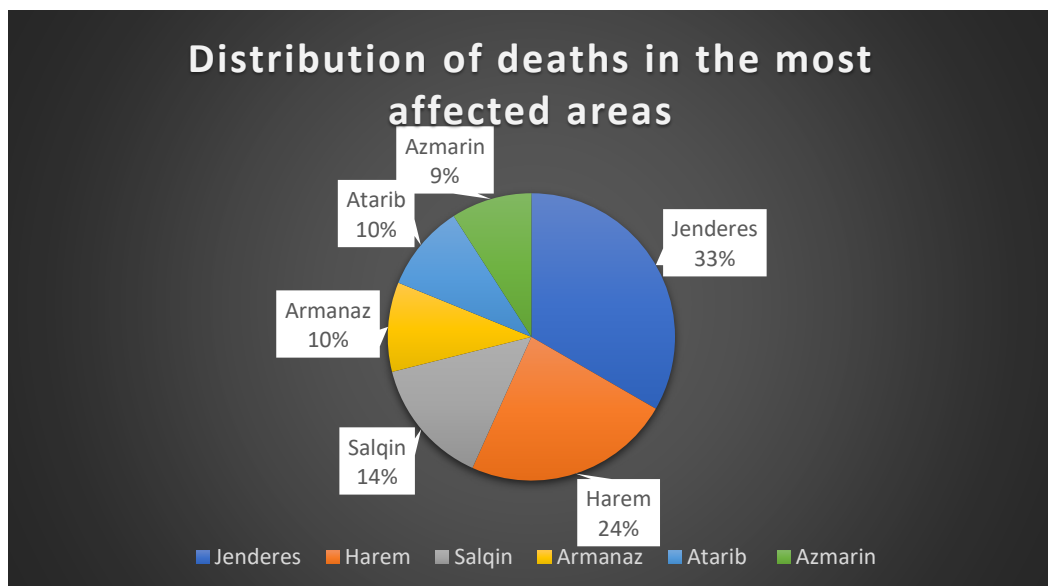

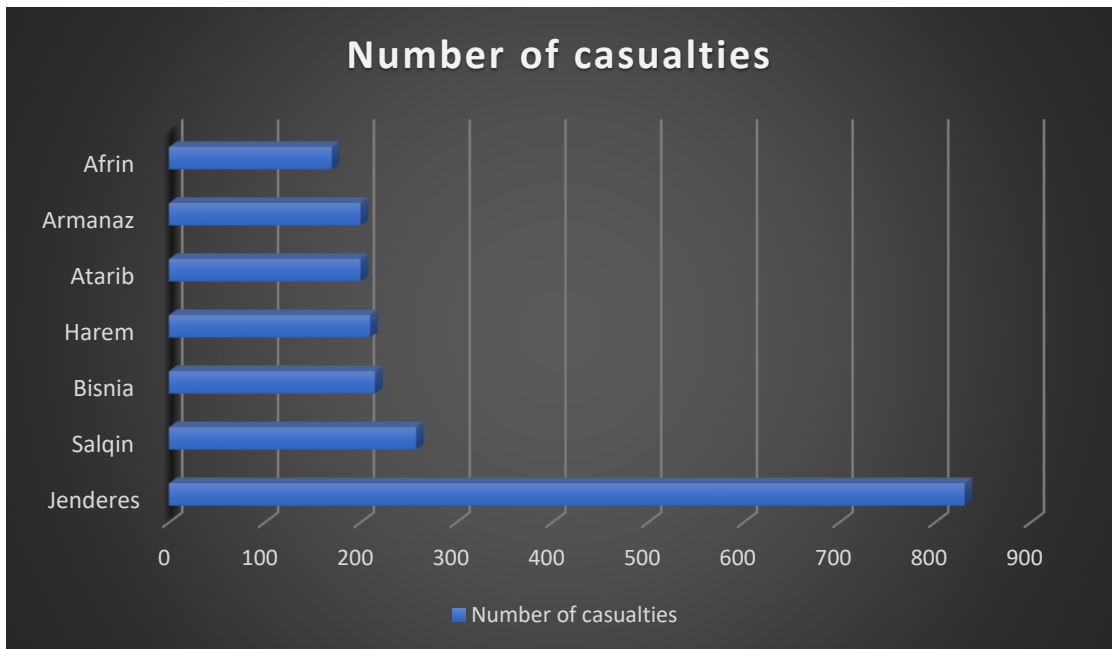

.Since Thursday, February 9, no survivors have been rescued from under the rubble alive

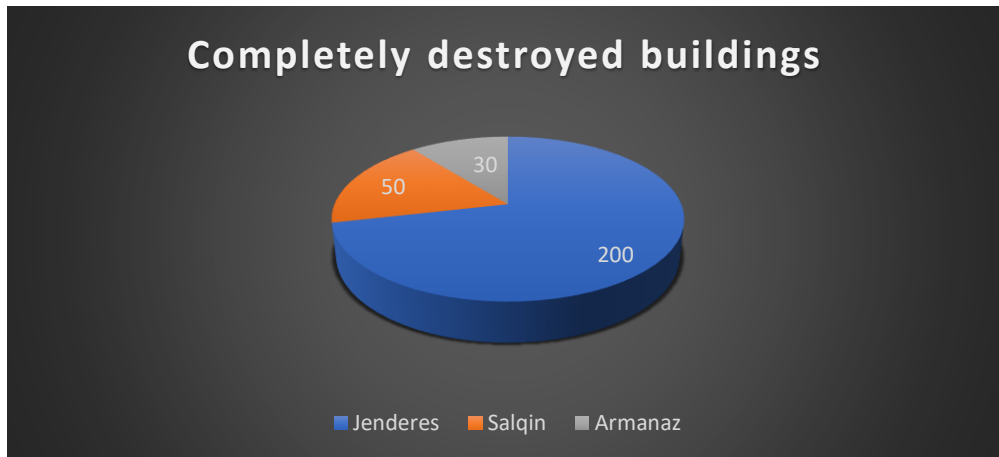

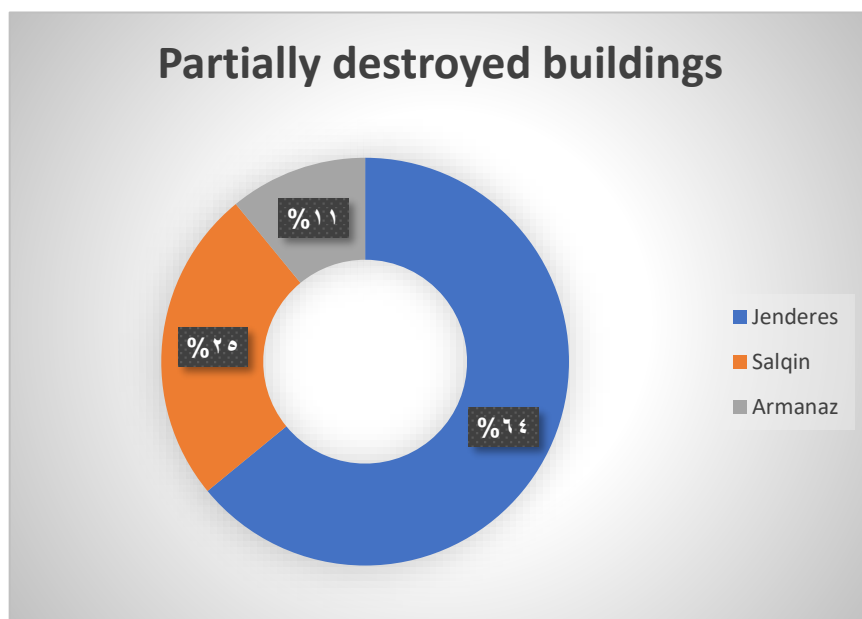

ten elderly wives who do not have a breadwinner, along with their children, have meals, water, a set of blankets, and milk for children
